WAI'ALAE: "Mudhen water." This ahupua'a takes its name from the spring which bears the same name and served as the main watering system for the area. Several outlets from the spring flowed into the lower terraces and gulches surrounding the land division. The spring was considered a secret water source for ali'i in earlier days, and only their descendants were able to locate the exact spot of the spring whenever a visiting chief became thirsty and inquired as to the whereabouts of fresh water for him to drink.
